Spelling rules needed:

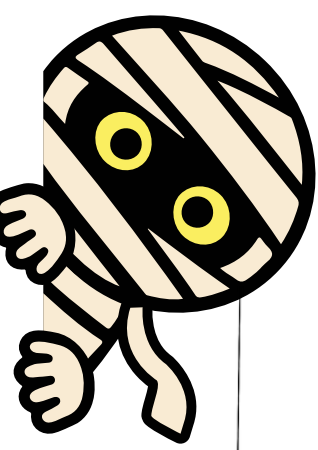
- A digraph is 2 letters that make one sound like ck or ng
- Doubling Rule for adding suffix ing- 1 syllable base word with 1 short vowel and 1 consonant, when adding a vowel suffix, double the final consonant in the base word!
- Suffix ness and suffix less
- "Survive" for example has an "r-controlled" /ur/ combo and in the second syllable, it has a Bossy E that is making the /i/ long like in "vive"

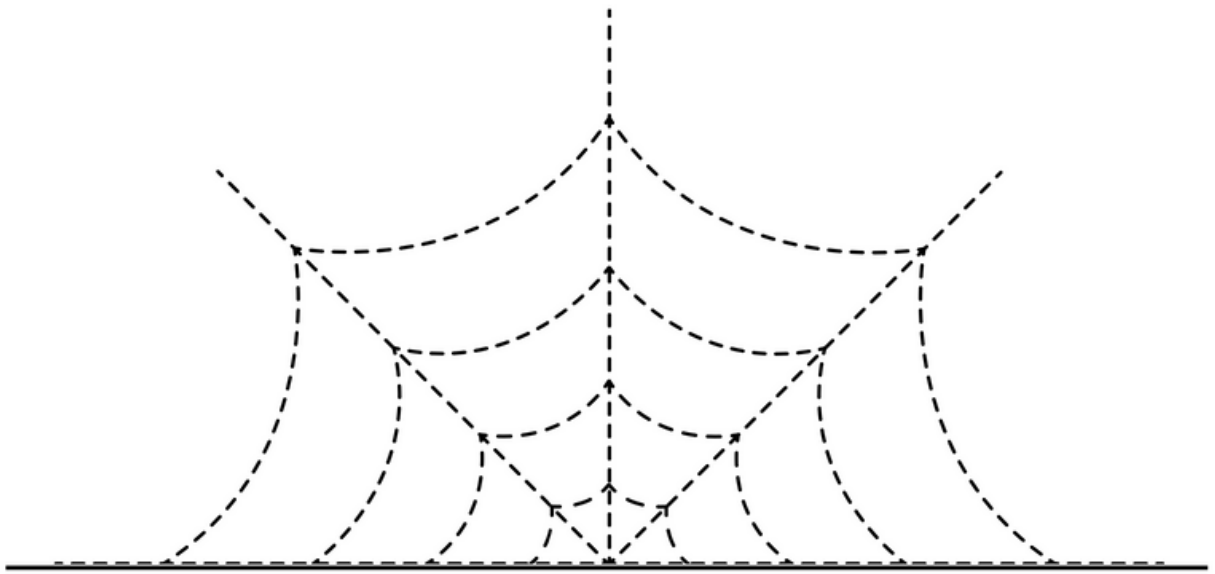

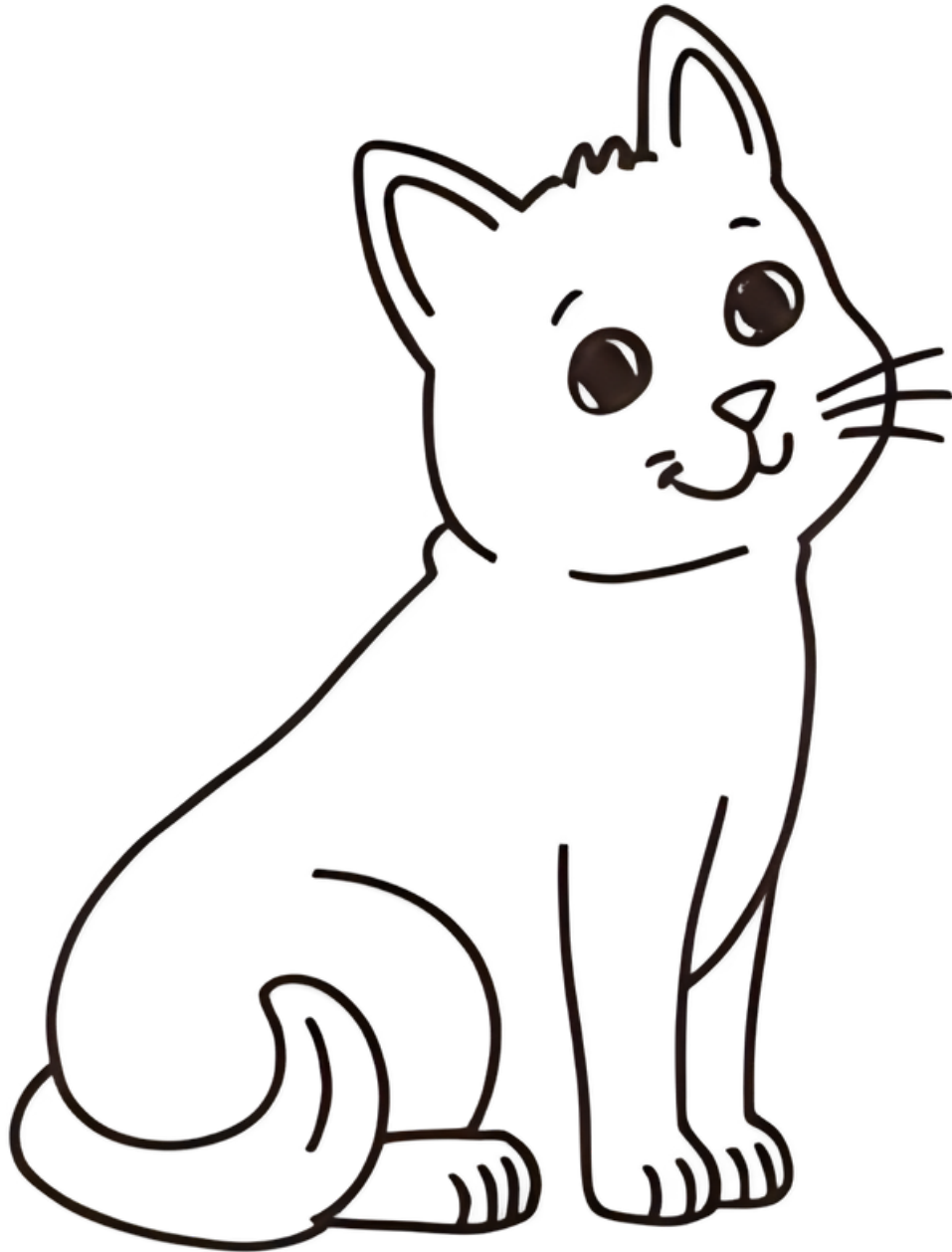

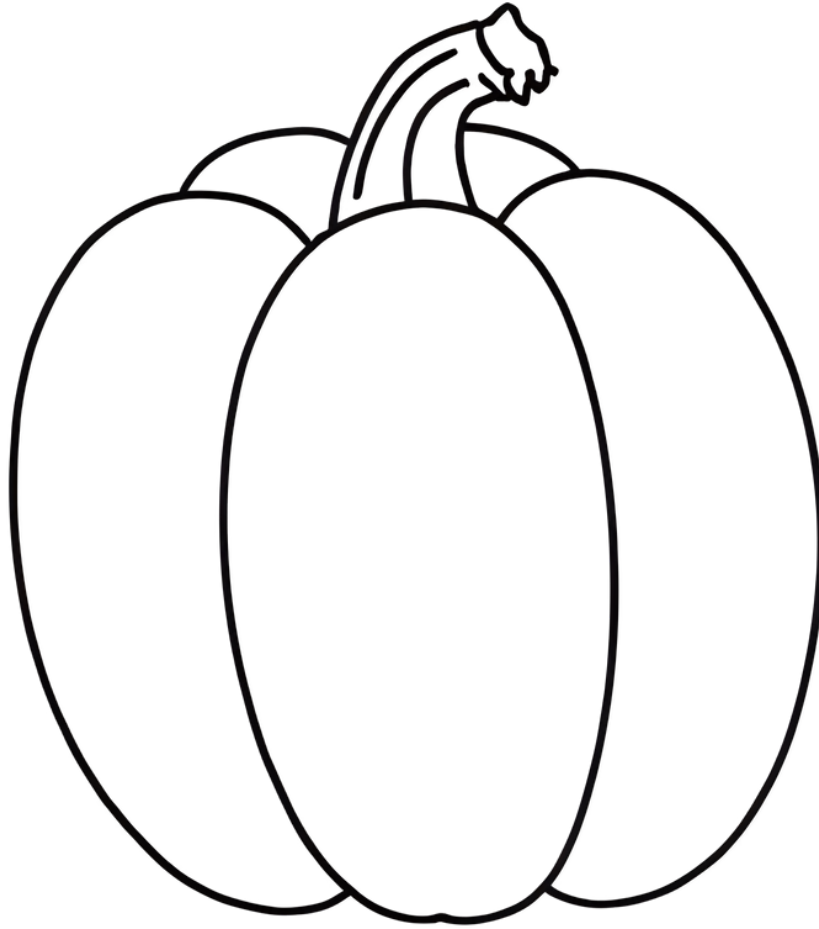

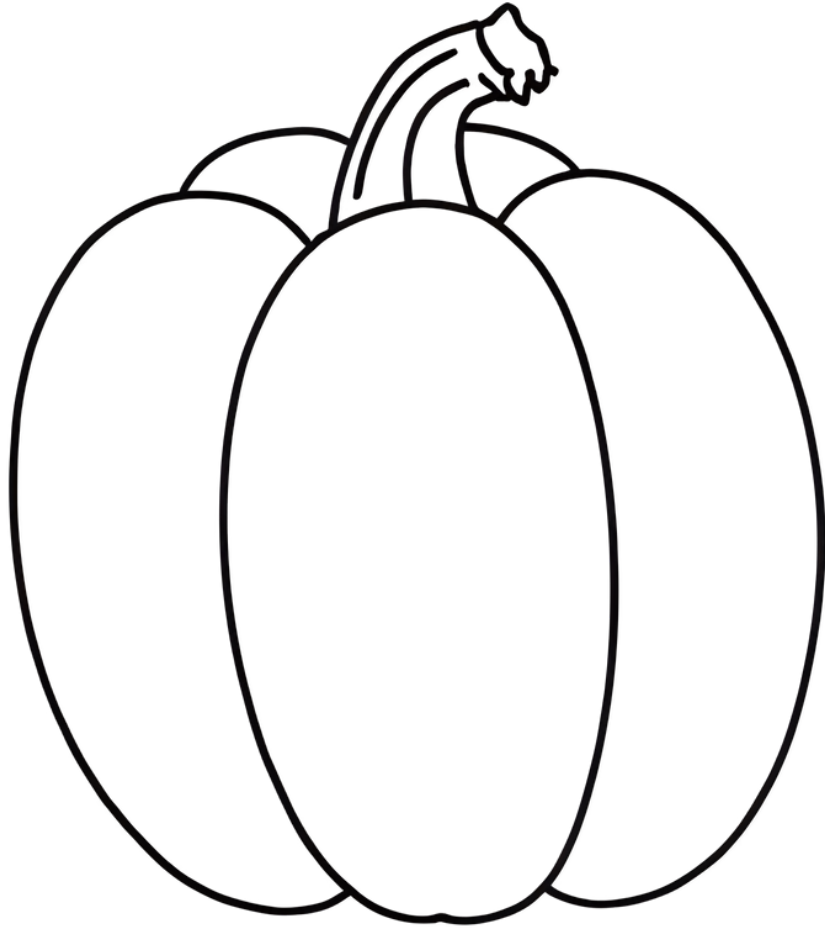
C a t (1 syllable)

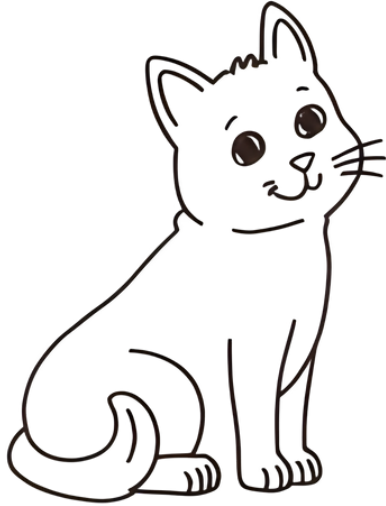

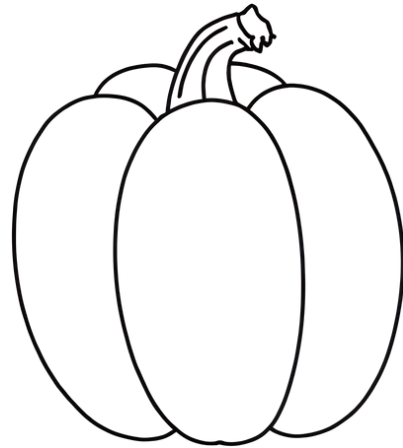

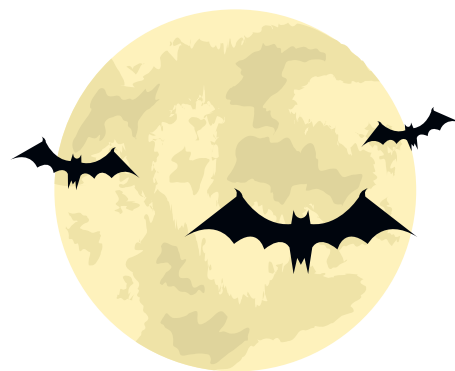
